-we can form the words by different, prefixes, suffixes, we can loan the words from different languages (pizza, sushi), we can create new words (e-commerce), we can compound the words (baby-sit, nevertheless, sugar-free), we can abbreviate the words (lab for laboratory) -sometimes you need to make a noun from a verb or you can make an adjective from a noun etc.		
noun= depth verb= deepen adjective= deep adverb= deeply strength strengthen strong strongly weakness weaken weak weakly
