## WORD FORMATION

-we can form the words by different, prefixes, suffixes, we can loan the words from different languages (pizza, sushi), we can create new words (e-commerce), we can compound the words (baby-sit, nevertheless, sugar-free), we can abbreviate the words (lab for laboratory) -sometimes you need to make a noun from a verb or you can make an adjective from a noun etc.

(comfortable, digestive, musical, heroic, touched, tiring, hopeless, skillful, religious, passionate, social)
people nouns: -er, -or, -ist, -ian, -ee (builder, visitor, pianist, librarian, employee)
some verbs: -ise/ize, -ate, -en (realize, alternate, shorten)
prepositions/adverbs (directions): ward(s) (downwards)
Negative prefixes: UN, IM, IN, DIS, IR, IL, A, AB, ANTI, MIS, NON, DE (unsure, impossible, insecure, disagree, irregular, illegal, atypical, abuse, anti-social, misunderstand, nonsense, dehydrate)

Other prefixes: RE, SUB, SEMI, MULTI, MONO, INTER, POST, PRO, SUPER, PRE, HEMI, AUTO, FORE (remake, submarine, semiconductor, multipurpose, mono-acting, international, postwar, profeelings, superman, premature, hemisphere, automobile, foresee)

-a particular thing, in singular and plural, it is clear in the situation which thing or person we mean
-with countable nouns in singular, when we talk about something unknown or for the first time
